Examination Expectations for Students

1. Students should check the Examination Schedule to determine the dates and times of all their examinations. **CIRCLE ALL OF YOUR COURSES TO ENSURE YOU DO NOT MISS AN EXAMINATION.**
2. Students who have an examination conflict i.e., two examinations scheduled at the same time are to report the conflict to Debra McKelvey or Sue Dhillon in the Guidance Office by Thursday December 16, 2021.
3. All exams will be held in the regular classroom unless otherwise indicated on the schedule.
4. Students are expected to be in the examination room at least 5 minutes before the examination begins.
5. Students are allowed to ask only two questions during an examination.
6. Students are required to be in school only when they are writing an examination. Students should arrive at least 15 minutes prior to the examination.
7. Students must not wander the halls or visit their lockers while examinations are being written.
8. Students are to bring their own pens and pencils, calculators and rulers to the examination room. Books, backpacks, phones, translators, purses and jackets are to be left in the student's lockers or vehicle. **No food or drink** is allowed in the examination room. **DO NOT** leave belongings in the hallways.
9. Additional Information:
 - a. Students who fail to write an examination will receive zero unless a medical note verifying the absence is submitted to Wayne McKelvey on the day of the exam.
 - b. Students who have missed an exam for medical reasons will be expected to write the exam before the marks meetings commence.
 - c. Students missing exams for illegitimate reasons will receive zero.
 - d. Students who are caught cheating on an examination will receive a zero for that examination.
 - e. Students in grades 9-12 who score less than 40% on their final evaluation will not receive a credit in the course.
10. Exam Schedule Changes:
 - a. We will not reschedule any exams for any reason other than illness (in which case a doctor's note is required).
 - b. Please do not ask to have an exam rescheduled for vacation or any other personal reason.
